







RREUSE NETWORK IMPACT 2018

Policy needs and what's on RREUSE's radar

Key EU Strategies

- ❖ EU Green Deal (Dec. 2019)
- Circular Economy Action Plan (Mar. 2020)
- EU Social Economy Action Plan (Expected mid 2021)

1. Setting re-use and preparation for re-use targets

- EU Waste Framework Directive (measurement indicators / potential targets (2025)/ proposals for waste reduction targets for specific streams in 2022)
- WEEE Directive potential recast in the next four years + developments under Basel convention
- Circular Electronics initiative 2020 (WEEE collection / deposit schemes)

REUSE 2020

2. Ensure EPR implement the waste hierarchy

- Waste Framework Directive (enhanced implementation of EPR requirements)
- **EU Strategy for Textiles** (consideration of EPR to support separate collection objectives)

Note: France will oblige EPR schemes to divert 5% of income to support social enterprise re-use operators

3. Reparability and durability requirements

- Ecodesign Directive and implementing measures
- Sustainable product policy proposal 2021 including wider remit on textiles and furniture
- Right to Repair strategy (potential) linked to consumer law - 2021

Note: Repairability criteria for domestic washing machines, dishwashers and fridges come into force in 2021

4. Green and Social procurement

- Public Procurement Directive (MEAT criterion and awareness raising of good practices)
- Green Public Procurement (GPP criteria development and convergence with social criteria)

Note: An increasing number of municipalities / private companies are rewarding bidders against social criteria

5. Reduced VAT rates for re-use / repair

- VAT Directive revision (ongoing since 2018)
- CEAP promotes better use of VAT for circularity (notably for repair services)

Note: A number of member states have set reduced VAT for social enterprises active in environmental services

6. Wider fiscal incentives to support social enterprise

- Multi-annual financial framework (MFF)
- Recovery Package
- ESF+ / H2020

Note: Social enterprises have been retained as key impacted actors as part of EC's ongoing work regarding the COVID recovery

7. Greater recognition of social impact and social enterprise in general

- Cross departmental capacity building about importance of social enterprise
- Social Economy Action Plan
- European Semester process and link to MFF
- Social impact metrics

Note: A number of RREUSE members have / are developing metrics to demonstrate social / environmental benefits of re-use toward the consumer


8. Cross-sectoral recognition of social enterprise

- Engagement in European Semester Process
- European Social Economy Action Plan
- Circular Economy Action Plan (social enterprise recognised as pioneers in the circular economy)

Product specific policy files

- EU textile strategy
- Circular electronics initiative
- Farm to Fork Strategy (Pillar of Green Deal)
- Renovation Wave (Pillar of Green Deal)
