


## NIRN Summary Report 2020

Northern Ireland Resources Network is a pilot project to establish a representative body for reuse and repair organisations and local authorities. NIRN connects community groups, charities, social enterprises and local authorities across Northern Ireland to promote less waste and supports the growth and collaboration between these reuse and repair organisations.

Our objectives are to establish a network which understands the needs and supports our members, promote reuse and repair and develop this sector in Northern Ireland through promotion and celebration of this sector's achievements, policy input and representation at local, national and international level.

## Key achievements for 2020 include the following:


- Network coordinator employed and office set up
- Establishment of a Steering Committee incorporating representative organisations engaged with the reuse and repair sector including governmental department, local authority, social enterprise, charities and community organisations whilst ensuring a geographical spread across Northern Ireland.



- Monthly meetings of an engaged and enthusiastic Steering Committee held since August and approval provided on the following :
  - Terms of reference for the Pilot Project
  - Membership policy, screening process for new members and membership form, membership payment structure
  - Approval of Northern Ireland Resources Network (NIRN) as organisation name along with collaboration and agreement on logo and strapline.



 Creation of social media presence on Facebook, Twitter, Instagram and Linkedin along with dedicated pages on CRNI website. Featured on MyNI - site used by governmental departments and other public sector organisations to engage with the public in Northern Ireland.



 Key milestone of 10 members joined the network: 4R's Reuse Workshop, Belfast City Council, Belfast Tool Library, British Heart Foundation, Cloughmills Community Action Team, FareShare NI, Derry City & Strabane District Council, Fermanagh & Omagh District Council, Repair Cafe Belfast and Zero Waste North West. Of note, Derry City & Strabane District Council - officially the first region in UK & Ireland to become Zero Waste, Cloughmills Community Action Team previous recipient of European Week for Waste Reduction Award, and Repair Cafe Belfast - group which organises repair events across Belfast and collaborates to support the development of other repair cafes in Northern Ireland.
